- •In her Master's thesis, she undertook a qualitative investigation of the experience of infertility in Greece, which was a highly sensitive topic in 1998 due to the limited availability of Assisted Reproduction Centers and the lengthy waiting lists for treatment.
- •In her doctoral research, as the principal investigator, she examined the interfamily relationships and the psychological and emotional development of children born via in vitro fertilization (IVF). The primary objectives of the study were to compare the psychological and emotional profiles of IVF adolescents with those born spontaneously and to investigate the dynamics of the family following IVF treatment. The researcher explored how the children, their parents, and teachers perceived themselves and the parent-child bonding during adolescence, and whether any differences existed due to the mode of conception. The study also aimed to identify potential stress levels experienced by parents during the exercise of their parental functions and to suggest future interventions for the parenthood preparation of infertile couples who wish to become parents. The researcher used questionnaires and semi-structured, face-to-face interviews with the IVF parents as research tools. The study results showed that the mean scores of both the IVF and control (spontaneous conception) groups were within the normal range, indicating overall favorable behavioral and emotional functioning in both groups. The findings confirm a growing body of research on the overall positive adjustment and functioning of families created through IVF during adolescence.
- •Both of the above-mentioned research studies were groundbreaking for the time in which they were conducted, and her Ph.D. research was the inaugural Greek investigation into families who explored IVF-conceived children during puberty.
