

## **CURRICULUM VITAE**

**Jane Sandall CBE, PhD, FMedSci, MSc, BSc, HV, RM, RN**

Jane is Professor of Social Science and Women's Health, School of Life Course Science, King's College, London. She was appointed the first Head of Maternity and Midwifery Research at NHS England in 2021. This inaugural role is focused on strengthening the translational research pathway to policy, to which she brings experience of co-chairing a Department of Health (England) Midwifery 2020 review of the contribution of midwifery to maternity policy and practice and as a ministerial appointed expert on the Irish Maternity strategy.

Recognised as a global leader in maternity research, Jane was ranked top expert on Midwifery in the world by [Expertscape](#) in 2022, and sits on the inaugural WHO Strategic and Technical Advisory Group of Experts (STAGE) for maternal, newborn, child, adolescent health, and nutrition advising the Director General.

Her research focuses on the effect and implementation of innovations to improve safety and women's experience, and prevent maternal and perinatal mortality and morbidity. The *Lancet series on the contribution of midwifery to preventing maternal and perinatal mortality and improving quality of care*, and *Lancet Series on Optimising Caesarean Section* both inform WHO and maternal health policies. Findings from *Birthplace in England* on the availability, safety, and organization of maternity services inform NHS England policy and NICE guidance on place of birth. She leads a *Cochrane Review on Continuity of Midwife Care* which highlights beneficial impact for women and reduction in preterm birth and fetal loss, informs UK, Australian, Irish and WHO policy, and guidelines. Currently her *trials of complex interventions* in low, middle, and high income countries are contributing to the field of hybrid-implementation trial methodology and implementation science.

She received an NIHR Senior Investigator Award 2015-2019, was awarded a CBE for services to women's health in 2016, and Honorary Fellowship of the Royal College of Midwives in 2019. She was the second midwife elected to the Academy of Medical Sciences in 2024.
